## Clothing

Please make sure every item of your child's uniform is named, including coats and shoes. We encourage children to play out in all weather, so please send appropriate clothing, including PE days. Please ensure hats, scarves and gloves are named.

#### Drinks

Please note that children should bring drinks to school in addition to those in their lunch boxes. Milk and water are available for the children to access at story time.

#### PE

We advise that children wear their PE kit to school on a Thursday. This will ensure children can take part in all PE sessions. Please ensure they have sensible footwear that can also be worn outside and their coat. Children should not wear jewellery and any ear piercings that cannot be taken out should be covered with a plaster.

# Our Home Learning Schedule

To help your child and share in their learning we would encourage:

- 5 minutes reading together (4 x per week to earn dojo points).
- Name and letter writing.
- Writing lists can they help make a shopping list or a 'to do' list?
- Finding maths problems in everyday situations, comparing quantities, measures or patterns. Can they solve a problem using their number skills?
- Continue to build your child's home learning evidence on their Dojo portfolio.
- Practise dressing and undressing buttons, clasps and turning things the right way.
