Phonics – Little Wandle (Phase 1)

The most important aspects of Foundations for Phonics to develop in the nursery are:

- sharing high-quality stories and poems with children
- learning a range of nursery rhymes and action rhymes
- activities that develop focused listening and attention, including oral blending
- attention to high-quality language with children

Maths

Recognising and counting numbers to 5.

To say number names to 5 in order.

To show an awareness and name some 2D shapes in the environment.

Sing number songs and rhymes.

Home Learning Ideas

- Learn a range of different nursery rhymes.
- Share and discuss a variety of different books.
- Sing a range of number songs.

Clothing

Please make sure every item of your child's uniform is named, including coats and shoes. We encourage children to play out in all weather, so please send appropriate clothing

Snacks

Each day the children will have access to water, milk and fruit during their session in Nursery.

Water bottles
